Dinner was at the restaurant Zingari on Post Street in San Francisco, just a block away from the Curran Theatre. We had a truly wonderful Italian meal, with outstanding service from the restaurant staff, including the owner! The restaurant opened early for us, and we had a terrific private dining room. Because we were a bit on the early side, we never had to rush to head to the theatre, so a leisurely meal was enjoyed by all.

Arriving at the Curran, we had a bit of a wait until they opened the doors...but it was so worth it. Having bought the tickets in January of this year, we had excellent seats in the orchestra section. (It was unfortunate that we had to return half of the tickets, for a full refund, due to lack of participation for this event.)

The show was nothing but spectacular! We knew the story and first met the “war horse” when he was a pony. As a puppet, this pony was guided by two men on the “outside” of the pony. It was exceedingly clever as to how the pony was moved around the stage, and you found yourself wondering how the “big” horse was going to work.



KAZAM...all of a sudden there was the truly life-size War Horse. Amazing, stunning, fabulous, etc.!

The large horse was “worked” by two men inside the horse...and these men were true artists. The ears and tail of the horse worked just like a real horse, and the movements of the hooves were so realistic. Even when the horse reared, it was authentic. In fact, after a few minutes, one “forgot” that this horse was just a large puppet...you thought you were looking at a real horse!



But it got better...not just one horse was in the play, but there were four other horses, just as big as the War Horse! This was truly amazing. The story somewhat followed the movie production, but had a much happier ending. While the actors did an excellent job, the men (all of them) under the horses were the true stars. A standing ovation was given to all those men, particularly the two that controlled the War Horse.



The trip back to Cupertino was filled with fun chatting and all of us feeling we had seen something so very special...and we had! HPREC Hikers Revisit Butano Redwoods in September

Six hikers sought refuge from the valley heat at Butano State Park, nine years after our first hike there. In spite of budget problems, Butano trails are among the best maintained in the system, due largely to a group of coastal volunteers. In fact, the Six Bridges Trail now has nine bridges, according to a formal HPREC audit.

The place name Butano is Native American for "a gathering place for friendly visits." Our friendly visit involved a mellow stroll along Little Butano Creek, which has a mix of old-growth and second-growth redwoods in a stunning riparian setting. There may be a Big Butano Creek somewhere, but we did not locate it.

Very few flowers are left this time of year, but we did see some spotted coral root orchids among the redwoods and wood mint in the open area near a recovering alder grove. The park has a bat hotel which was inactive when we saw it near mid-day.

Butano is a 3800-acre park near Pescadero with about 20 miles of trails and one of the best campgrounds in the system. It is practically deserted this time of year, so be sure to visit it soon.

Getting there: The Park is located five miles south of Pescadero, on Cloverdale Road, and off Highway One from Gazos Creek Road.

Golden Gate Bridge Lite Hike

We hiked portions of the Juan Bautista de Anza, the Wild Rye, the Paseo del Roble, Arastradero Creek, Woodrat, Meadowlark, Woodland Star, Bay Laurel, and Ohlone trails.

TRAVEL TALK

By Your Travel Committee



If you have read our review of the trip we made to see *War Horse* at the Curran Theatre in San Francisco, you know that we are looking at a faster way of getting to see wonderful theatre productions in the San Francisco area. Our “normal” process usually takes over 5 months to get the event formalized, flier printed, and sign-ups received. That makes it difficult for members to plan so far in the future, as well as being able to respond to some of the fabulous productions that are advertised within a much shorter window.

Therefore, your Travel Committee would like to propose a new and different way of attending theatre productions in the San Francisco area... a way that would require reservations and commitments made over e-mail and a very fast response time from members. The following is a brief outline of how we envision such a THEATRE ONLY process working:

1> The Travel Committee will create a customized e-mail list from members who indicate they are sincerely interested in attending theatre productions in San Francisco or other locales that might require utilizing a bus for transportation. Such a list would be updated as HPREC members provide their addresses, etc.

2> When a theatre production is announced, a member of the Travel Committee would generate an “urgent” e-mail to the customized distribution list, with ticket and date information listed on the e-mail.

3> The member would have SEVEN business days to respond about attending, with the assumption that no response means no interest. If responding “Yes”, we will consider that as a commitment to buying the ticket and paying for bus service. (Depending on how long we use a bus, and how many people sign up for the event, the cost can range from \$22 to \$27.)

4> The Travel Committee would compile the e-mail commitments and then commit to buying xx amount of tickets for the specific production, using Group Rates. We would also finalize bus costs and notify responding members of their required payment to HPREC. Such a payment would be sent within SEVEN business days to the usual HPREC address in Mountain View, which we review at least once a week.

5> We would also send out a message to respondents about additional activities associated with the theatre event, such as including a dinner or lunch, where we might hold such a dinner or lunch, and associated menus. That may or may not require additional monies being sent to HPREC, depending on any arrangements we might make with a restaurant, etc.

6> If difficulties arise trying to collect payment from members who do sign up, we will remove that name or names from our distribution list and eliminate any future distributions to those members. Obviously true emergencies are always taken into consideration.



Hike Location: Coyote Hills Regional Park in Fremont. This East Bay Regional Park adjoins the San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge and offers trails in marshes, grasslands and hills with killer views. It is dotted with Ohlone Indian sites. Our route will be kept short of five miles so we can climb some strenuous hills. The area is exposed to bay winds. We should see some raptors, shore birds and a few migratory bird species. To get there take Highway 84 across the Dumbarton Bridge to Paseo Padre Parkway in Fremont. Go about 1.2 miles north on Paseo Padre, then turn left onto Patterson Ranch Road. Go through the entry kiosk, where there is a \$5 parking fee, and then park at the visitor center.

Meet at: The Arastradero Preserve parking area to carpool. From I-280, turn southwest on Page Mill Road. Go .5 mile to Arastradero Road and then go .5 mile to the Preserve. Bring water, lunch, \$3 each to reimburse the carpool drivers, and additional money to help with the bridge toll and parking fee.



Its plaintive adagio is a tribute to his idol Richard Wagner, who at their final meeting declared Bruckner the equal of Beethoven.




