Peters Creek Old-Growth Forest

Our hike to the Peters Creek Old-Growth Forest was led by Gordon Clark and Ann Duwe from the Peninsula Open Space Trust (POST). Ordinarily, if one was to hike to this wonderful grove, one would have to hike some eleven miles round trip. Our hike was considerably shorter (~five miles) due to the ability to use the POST entry point just before entering Portola State Park.

POST and Save the Redwoods League have partnered to purchase and permanently protect 359 acres of this redwood forest near La Honda. It is said that the forest contains the third-largest old-growth redwood grove in the Santa Cruz



Mountains. The land was purchased from Larry and Leona Holmes who have owned the property since the early 1970's. Once the acquisition is completed, plans are to transfer the property to Portola State Park. This process is similar to that taken with regard to HP's Little Basin property a few years ago.

The route taken to view these hundreds of feet tall redwoods was quite easy except for a few stream crossings which tested our balance in order to keep our feet dry. Assisting one another resulted in everyone getting across with nary a spill. Gordon and Anne were excellent docents, stopping quite often to inform the group of the history of the land, its flora and fauna and of the future as it pertains to finalizing the purchase and eventual transfer to the State.

Getting there: For now, if you wish to hike to the Grove, one needs to enter Portola State Park and take the trail for about an eleven-mile round trip. Portola State Park can be accessed by going west on Page Mill Road, crossing Skyline Blvd and proceeding west on Alpine Road. Take the left at the "Y" to enter the Park.

HP History Lite Hike

December's Lite Hike was a real trip down memory lane. This photo from *Watts Current* is the Administration Building at 395 Page Mill Road. It was HP's World Headquarters in the 1950's until HP built at 1501 Page Mill Road in the 1960's.



Our hike began at HP's current worldwide headquarters at 3000 Hanover; we proceeded down Page Mill Road to the site where HP moved when they outgrew the garage at 367 Addison Avenue. The building (Polly & Jakes Cabinet Shop) was in the back of the Tinker-Bell building at the corner of what was then Hwy 101 and Page Mill Road. It was owned by Mr. and Mrs. John Bell who had moved across the street to larger living quarters. This building later became the site of Polly & Jakes, an antique store.

On the way, Steve Roberts and Gary Ruppel compared stories of Mayfield Elementary School

which was located north on El Camino Real. We walked down to the site of HP's first company owned building, the Redwood Building at 395 Page Mill Road. Construction on it started in 1942. It was at this site that, in 1953, HP completed buildings 7 and 8; they then had 100,000 feet of factory space. 395 Page Mill Road eventually became the site of Agilent Technologies' first corporate headquarters. It is now occupied by AOL and Disney

Interactive. Steve Roberts told us what it was like growing up across the street from HP's site, where his family owned acreage. John Trone and Steve each shared stories of how you could not get a job at HP without knowing someone.



We then proceeded down Park Blvd where, among other things, the cable shop used to be. The place is now a big hole in the ground where a large office building will be constructed. On the way back to HP's current headquarters, we strolled by the buildings that used to house the Bayside Cannery and shared more stories of the olden days.

As of this writing, we do not have enough members interested in such a 2-day trip. Therefore, your Committee will pause any further action on this event in hopes of getting at least 40 people indicating a high level of interest. So, if you think you would like to attend such an event, let us know immediately. At our February Committee meeting, we will be deciding if this is a "GO or NO GO".

This coming year will find offerings of trips to the Elkhorn Slough (we did this about 5 years ago, and it was immensely popular), *Jersey Boys* in San Jose (see flyer in this issue), a midwest trip to Illinois, Wisconsin, and Michigan (this has been listed in several issues), and Golden Gate Fields. Other trips are in the preliminary stages of identifying and planning.

Please note that our bus trips are wheelchair accessible and the drivers are super respectful and careful in managing any handicapped members and/or guests. Also, please remember that each member is able to bring one guest. If you want to bring more than one guest, you must contact a Committee member to see if we can accommodate additional non-HPREC members. We usually can do just that, but you must check before you send in a reservation.

So, as we start this new year, we really hope you will become an active member in your Club and join your fellow retirees for fun, food, music, drama, and adventures. We sincerely hope to see you very soon!

You will be pleased to know that there are no changes to the DeltaCare USA DHMO dental plan premiums from January 1, 2013. These *quarterly* rates are effective through December 31, 2014:

<i>Employee</i>	<i>\$ 93.01</i>
<i>Employee + one dependent</i>	<i>\$146.91</i>
<i>Employee + two or more dependents</i>	<i>\$211.36</i>

HPREC's dental plan is administered by Delta Dental of California. You must be a member of HPREC and living in California to enroll. You can enroll in the plan by emailing hprecdeltadental@gmail.com and providing your name and address. You will receive an application shortly thereafter.

The list of participating dental offices in Northern California, a summary of the program, as well as detailed benefits and copayments are at our website: www.hpretirees.com/hprec/dental.shtml, or you can also go directly to the Delta Dental website for their list of participating dentists: www.deltadentalins.com. (HPREC members should only search for DeltaCare providers.)

This may be a better deal than the similar AARP plan. (Note that HPREC, Inc. has no responsibilities or liabilities regarding this insurance. The plan is not administered by HPREC, Inc.; it is administered by Delta Dental of California.)

As far as we know, the HPREC is the only one of the official U.S. HP retired employee clubs with a dental program.

Knock on the glass door, show your HP ID, and Fran, the onsite Center manager, will open the door for you to gain access to the Center only. You will **not** be able to roam other parts of the building. Call Fran at 1-650-857-5954 if you have questions.

WHEN: Daily, between the hours of 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. and between 1:30-3:00 p.m. Fran's preference is that retirees use the Center before lunch. These are the more quiet hours when employees are not visiting the Center.

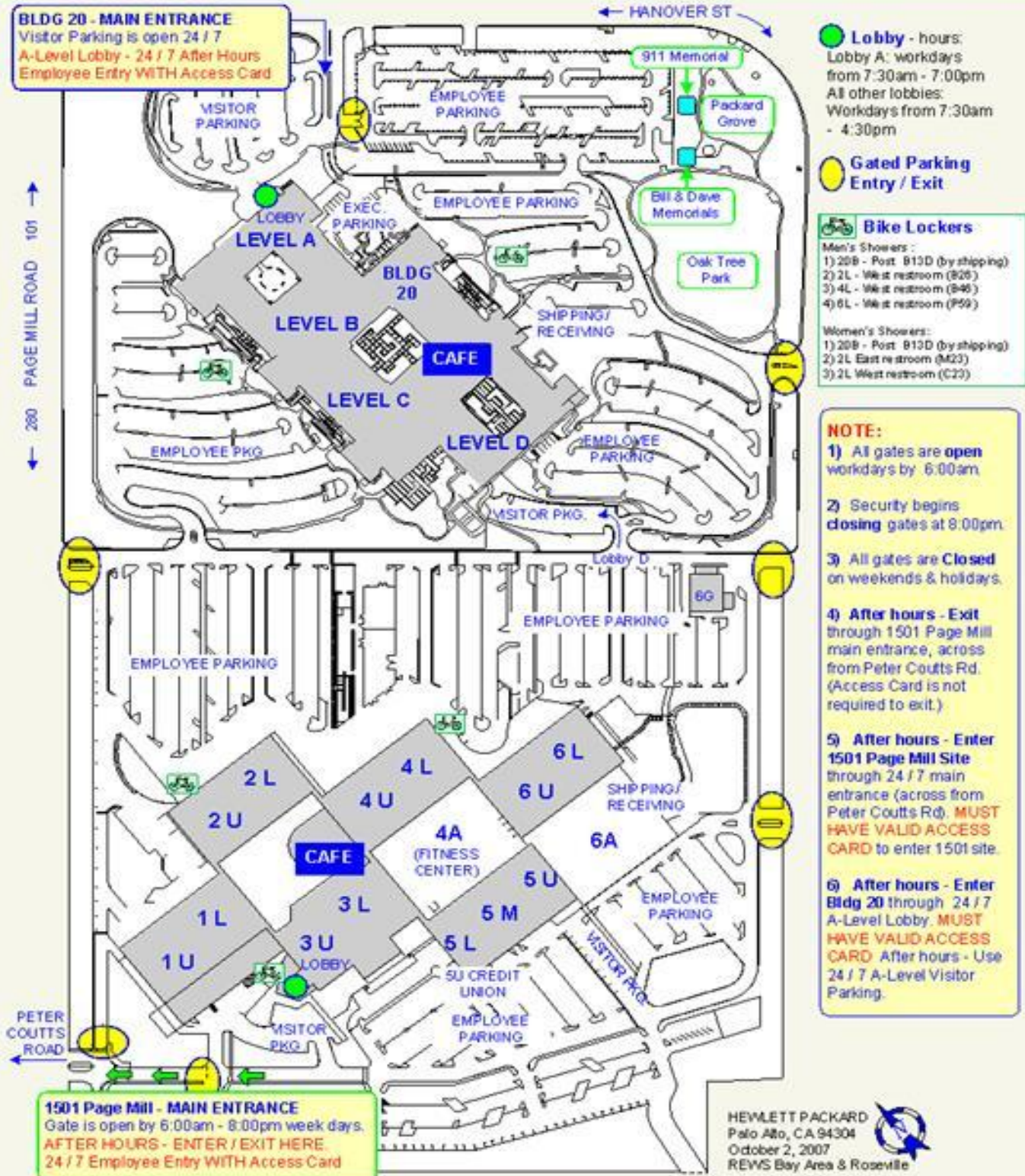
WHAT: Employees and retirees have a daily and monthly maximum quantity of FREE items. There are also daily limits that apply to ensure everyone has access.

Hike Location: Monte Bello is Italian for “beautiful mountain,” and the preserve is very aptly named. The rolling grasslands are interspersed with riparian corridors and dense stands of California bay, canyon oak, coast live oak, and madrone. From the summit of Black Mountain, hikers are treated to spectacular views of the Hamilton Range and the entire length of Santa Clara Valley. Monte Bello Ridge provides the scenic backdrop for the communities of Palo Alto, Los Altos, Mountain View, Cupertino, and Sunnyvale. Parking for this hike is at the lot across Page Mill Road from Los Trancos Open Space Preserve.

From the parking lot, we take the Canyon Trail, split off to the Bella Vista Trail, connect with Old Ranch Trail, and finally link up to the Black Mountain Trail to reach the summit at an elevation of 2812 feet. We stop for lunch at Black Mountain summit, but if the winds prove too strong, then the Black Mountain backpack camp below the summit is a good alternative. On our return, we can either retrace our steps, or take the Indian Creek Trail to connect with the Canyon Trail back to the parking area. The decision will be made on the spot based on weather and trail conditions. Restrooms are available at the parking lot and near our lunch stop. The length of this hike is around 5.2 miles, and the elevation gain is approximately 820 ft.

Bring: Please wear good hiking shoes and bring a stick if you have one. Don’t forget a hat, sunscreen, drinking water and lunch. Please bring \$2.00 to reimburse your friendly carpool driver.

Meet at: The usual carpool location at the Arastradero Preserve parking area at 10:00 a.m. Take 280 and turn southwest on Page Mill Road. Proceed .5 miles to Arastradero Road. Then go 1.2 miles to the Enid Pearson Arastradero Preserve parking area (with restrooms) on the right.

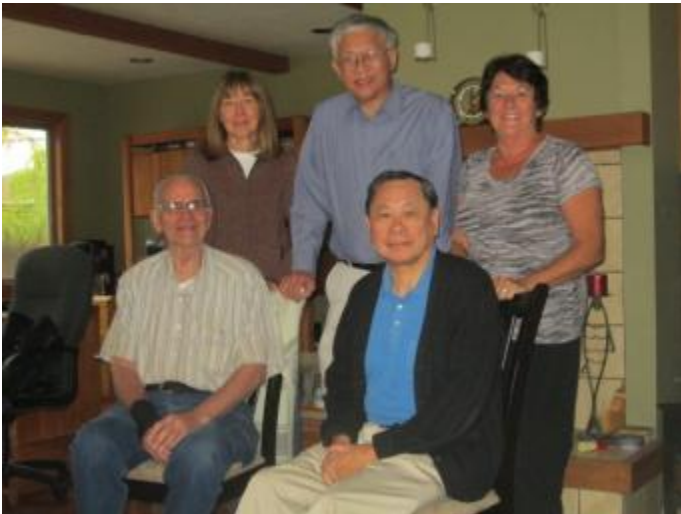

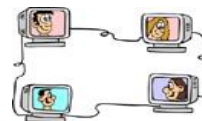
Stay Connected via Email...sign up to stop receiving paper newsletter

> For retirees to receive periodic emails from organizations that fit your interests, you have **three** places to sign up: HPREC, HP Continuum, and HPAA. For privacy reasons, these cannot be shared.

Reasons to sign up for HPREC's emails:

NOT receiving emails (from me) that your Club newsletter has been posted online?

Want to STOP receiving newsletter mailed to your home (to help save the Club 12K/year; save a few trees)?



NOT receiving emails (from a Board member) about important news that can't wait for the next newsletter?

To sign up for Club news, go to our HPREC home page www.hpretirees.com/hprec, go to Retiree Email List:

1) **If you have not yet added your email address** to our secure online directory, click on "Add your email address", review all available member options, then select your preferences listed below.

(a) stop receiving your paper version of the newsletter in the U.S. Mail and review it online in full color in one-column format; also saves printing/postage costs for the Club.

(b) receive an email notification (from me) each time a new newsletter has been posted to the website (every odd month).

(c) receive periodic emails from HPREC (less than one message per month) with pertinent Club-related news.

2) **If you previously added your email address and need to change something**, click on "Change existing email address or change member options." Make sure you've chosen "elect to receive an email notification (includes passwords) when your newsletter is posted to the Club website."

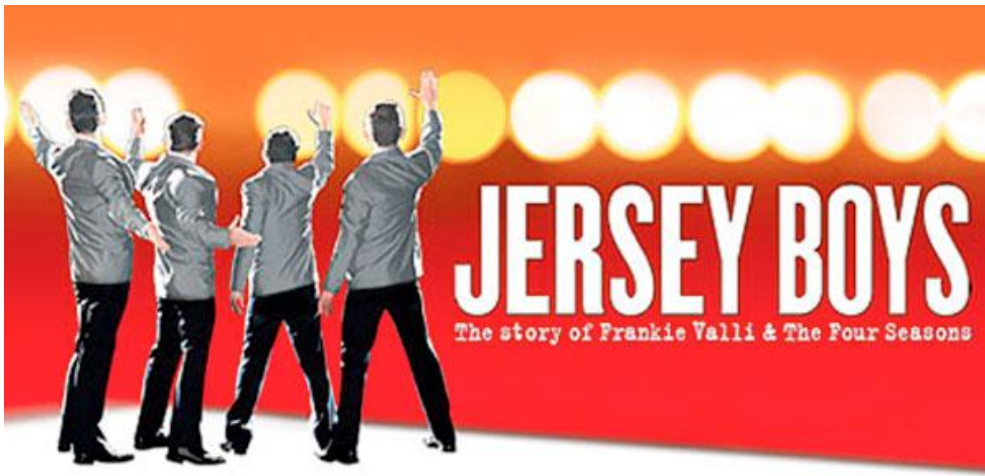
