If you can, please renew as soon as possible and via the ONLINE RENEWAL method, which this year includes a NEW feature, being able to vote online (see Carol's Corner article for more info.). Vote and pay only **once**, and following the deadlines will help our membership volunteers deal with a more manageable workload as well as help us with the cost incurred when we have to send follow up dues reminders. Thank you!

Recruitment: Please remember that the Club is as strong as its membership, so we continue to encourage all of you to think of friends and/or ex-colleagues who have retired from one of the companies that form our Club but are not yet members of HPREC. For this year's election, we have two candidates nominated for our Board of Directors by the Nominations Committee.

New Nominee - Dan Burke (HP - 24 years)

Dan joined HP in June of 1988 in a pre-sales organization called Customer Information Center (CIC) where he supported prospective customers. In this role, he worked with HP Enterprise hardware (HP3000s & HP9000s) as well as networking solutions; later on, he became the manager of the team. Dan has a passion for volunteering. It allows him to meet new people and keep his hand in doing interesting things. He is currently involved in a number of volunteer efforts including high school student mentoring. He joined the Club's Tech Team Committee in November 2015 and is enjoying reconnecting with familiar projects and discussions. "HPREC is allowing me to use my skill sets for HP retirees – a keen interest."

Dan is happily married with wonderful children. He loves golf, woodworking, music, plus he loves to backpack in the high Sierra country.

Existing Board Member – Re-election - Carol Nakamoto (HP - 34 years)

Carol worked for HP in Human Resources from March 1966 through August 2000, accepting EER. Her positions included Corporate Personnel in Records, moving to Mountain View Site in 1969 to help start up a Personnel Department for the three resident entities, Delcon Division, Customer Service Center, and Mountain View Division. She moved to the Cupertino site in 1981 to be Computer Groups Relocations Manager and Site Employment Manager, returning to Corporate in 1985 as Worldwide Relocations Manager for 10 years. She is very proud of adding family-friendly benefits to relocation programs and cost-saving policy changes to the Foreign Service Employee program, allowing more employees to be offered that opportunity. In 1995, she helped start a new resource in Corporate as Worldwide HR Acquisitions & Divestitures Consultant until her retirement. She loved her HP career, especially the company's support in allowing her to stay in management for 13 years in a part-time capacity while helping raise their son and daughter.

Carol enjoys retirement, spending time at their Santa Cruz beach house, and babysitting their two toddler grandchildren part-time (who thankfully live in the Bay Area). Carol first joined the HPREC Board in 2001, agreeing to a one-year stint as Vice President to give the Board time to find another candidate. After four years away (Bylaws require at least three), she agreed to rejoin the Board in October 2014 to fill the vacancy left when a Board member resigned after the first year of a three-year term; it ends this October. To continue on the Board, Carol needs to be approved by the membership.

Carol currently serves on the Board as the liaison to both HP Inc., Hewlett Packard Enterprise, and First Tech Federal Credit Union. She chairs the Communications Committee, writes Carol's Corner for *HPREC NEWS*, is a member of the newsletter editorial team, the Tech Team and the Membership Committee.

Volunteer Recognition *By Oscar Lombardi*

Dear fellow HPREC Club members,

In this publication, we feature **Elizabeth Shen**. You may recognize Elizabeth's name from the Delta Dental program and HPREC picnic organization as a member of the HPREC Board, where Elizabeth served from December 2009 to November 2015.

Elizabeth joined HP's Personal Computer Group (PCG) in 1984, when the Company was offering the Touchscreen PC to the world, and retired from Agilent in 2006, from Operations Systems Support (OSSG).



Most of Elizabeth's HP experience was on the computer side of the house with stints in hardware, software and distribution organizations, plus she also worked in HP Labs and Corporate Quality. Elizabeth was on assignment in a group-wide project in Components Group when the HP-Agilent split occurred (1999) and ended up on the Agilent side. Help Wanted! A Few Opportunities Still Open in HPREC!!

We are delighted to have **Gene Marshall** as our new Newsletter editor, officially starting with this issue. Welcome aboard, Gene! But, we still have several key openings that could use volunteers.

In the **Financial** area, Gordon Mullin and Phil Smith are looking for help to take over the keeping of the books (checking account and state/federal information returns) and budgets (annual budget and forecasts).

They are hoping to be able to "retire" in 2017 after many years and are happy to teach any volunteers the process. Time required: ~ 3-4 hours per month.

And finally, we really need a **Program Manager** to help pull together the **Annual Membership Directory** each December-February, working with the membership team and our Club Liaison to HP, Agilent and Keysight for HR

information. This requires up to 45 hours, primarily in January and early February. Taking over the coordinator role would begin next year in December 2017. We hope to involve someone to shadow the current coordinator this winter.

We could also use help from someone who has **strong MSWord** skills who can join a committee and assist in one of several areas. Work is done from home, and there are few or no meetings to attend:

- 1) membership forms/manual documentation (6-8 hours annual scrub, periodic updates 1-2 hours quarterly),
- 2) newsletter article review (6-8 hours bi-monthly) or
- 3) identify annual updates needed on website content and work with webmaster to ensure implementation (4-8 hours/year).

The Board understands that many of our retiree members are still working, often as volunteers or caregivers or as part-time employees and consultants, but the Club could really use some additional help.

Delta Dental Update *By Elizabeth Shen, HPREC Delta Dental Liaison*

HMO - HPREC members can enroll in Delta Dental's HMO plan faster and more easily now by enrolling online. If your dentist is in their network, this is a very cost effective plan. For more information about the plan description and enrollment process, go to the HPREC link <http://www.hpretirees.org/hprec/dental.php>.



For current plan enrollee(s), please note that the **quarterly rates** for the **two-year HMO plan** will increase 4.5% beginning **January 1, 2017**. The effective dates: January 1, 2017 - December 31, 2018:

Enrollee	\$93.01	\$97.20
Enrollee + 1 dependent	\$146.91	\$153.52
Enrollee + 2 or more dependents	\$211.36	\$220.87

PPO? - WE WANT YOUR INPUT! For those who are interested in dental insurance with the convenience and flexibility of visiting any licensed dentist, HPREC is investigating whether to offer a **Delta Dental PPO** plan in addition to the HMO plan, and if so, which one. There are two PPO proposals for HPREC members. **We'd like your input** on these offerings. If you'd like HPREC to offer a PPO plan, please review the plans below and email me at hprec.deltadental@gmail.com to **indicate your preference for Plan Option 1 or Plan Option 2**. Do so **no later than October 15, 2016**, so we can share the feedback in the November newsletter.

First things first: PPO plan services are paid based on percentages. For example, if fillings are covered at 70%, the enrollee pays the remaining 30%.



PPO – Plan Option 1: This is a STRAIGHT PPO plan. The payment allowed by Delta Dental is based on the PPO fee allowance for all dentists, regardless of membership network status.

PPO –Plan Option 2: This is a MIXED PPO plan. The payment allowed by Delta varies according to the dentist's membership status, as follows:

- Delta Dental PPO dentist: PPO fee allowance
- Delta Dental Premier dentist (non-PPO) Premier filed fee
- Non-participating dentist Fee that satisfies the majority of Delta Dental Dentists

Enrollee	\$192.81	\$168.97
Enrollee + 1 dependent	\$357.70	\$313.17
Enrollee + 2 or more dependents	\$598.98	\$521.51

For a current listing of PPO and Premier providers, please refer to Delta's website at www.deltadentalins.com. The site is updated regularly to keep it accurate. Payment allowances differ by the dental service received, e.g., the allowance for diagnostic and preventative care is 100% for DeltaCare dentists, 90% for DeltaCare Premium dentists, and 90% for non-Delta Dental dentists. Plan Option 1 and 2 details and allowances are also available for your review at the HPREC link above.

You must be an HPREC member and reside in California to enroll in these Delta Dental plans. Refer to the Club's website, **Dental Plan** link (above) for more details. There will be more information in the November newsletter.

Look on our Club's home page under **Hot News** to renew online.

Everyone will continue to receive a paper mailing at your home of their Dues Renewal Invoice and the Ballot around **September 15**. Either use the online features or send in the paper forms, but not both.☺ Your dues are due by **November 1**. *Paying your dues before THANKSGIVING avoids the extra Club expense of mailing a Dues Reminder to your home in early December.* It takes \$\$ and time to handle this, so **show your appreciation for our volunteers** in eliminating this extra work.

Your HPREC Travel Committee respectfully asks that you please read the “Reservation Process” we use when managing your submitted reservation forms. This process is used to make sure we fairly represent all members who submit forms for our various travel events. And we hope that this will assist both new members as well as refresh long-term members when signing up for events.



- 1> Please use the reservation form that is included on the flyer contained in your Newsletter.
- 2> Please make sure you PRINT the information so we can easily read your name and, especially, your email address. Remember, we are retirees and our eyesight is not that of a 20 year old!
- 3> Make sure you fill in ALL the information required. We do not make phone calls for missing information, but will be forced to return your form and check if the form is incomplete. You may resubmit after including required information.
- 4> Submit one check per event. You can mail several reservations together, but you MUST have one check per event. We request that so it becomes easier to send you back your check if a certain event has been cancelled. It eliminates our treasurer having to write checks to those members who wanted to go in a now-cancelled trip.
- 5> Keep a copy of the flyer with you, as it has all the necessary information for the trip/event.
- 6> If the flyer does not answer all your questions, please contact a listed Trip Leader for additional information. Please note the hours we are available to be contacted, as weekends and evenings are our family and relaxation time!
- 7> We do not give refunds for individual cancellations, unless it truly is an emergency. We carefully calculate the cost of any trip, so our fees are covered by the “reservation dollars.” Bus expenses are the highest cost of most trips, and we do not want the Club to underwrite the cost of our adventures.
- 8> We currently are using the Vallco parking area for bus pick-up and return, but construction activities may curb that rendezvous area. We will keep everyone posted on pick-up areas, where you can safely park your car during our bus activities.
- 9> We cancel trips when we do not get enough participants to justify the cost of our trip. Because we incur a \$50 fee when we cancel a bus within a 40 day window, we may cancel a trip before members fully support that activity. Therefore, sign up AS SOON AS you see an activity in which you wish to participate.

10> Guests are always welcomed, with no more than two per event. Contact the leader if you wish to bring more than 2 guests. We honor all reservations on a first-come-first-served basis, and we use postmark data if there is any question.

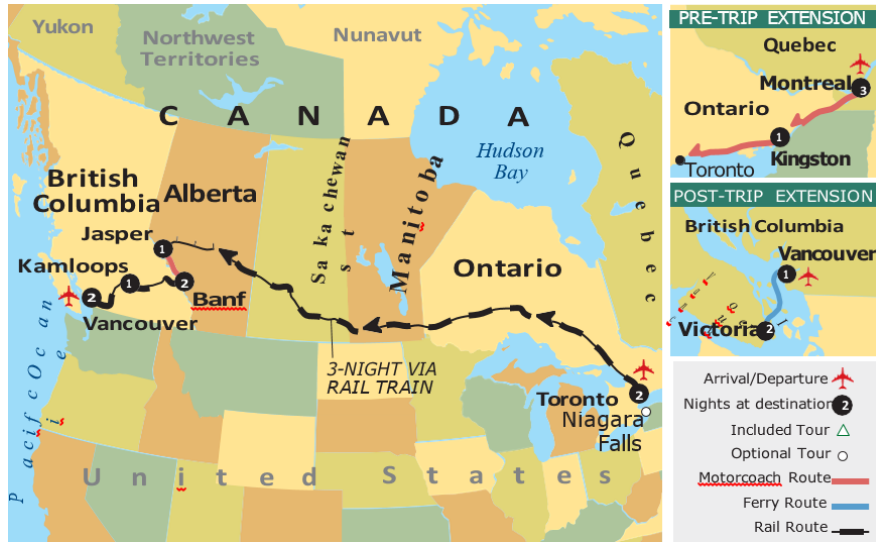

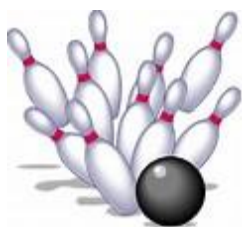

## HPREC Hiking News *Compiled by Gary Ruppel*

### **San Francisco Presidio** *By Chuck Sieloff (Leader) with photos by John McCabe*

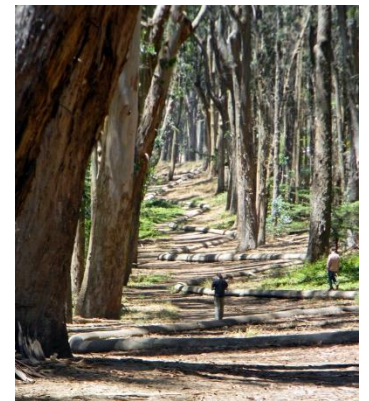
On June 12, a large group of 17 hikers, including several first-time participants, gathered at the Officers' Club in the San Francisco Presidio to begin a five-mile hike that showcased the natural beauty and historical significance of this unique National Park. The Presidio has been in constant use (by Europeans) since it was established as a military post by Spain in 1776. It served as a major U.S. Army post from 1846 until 1994, when it became a National Park managed by a private/public partnership between the National Park Service and the Presidio Trust.

The Greeter at the Officers' Club provided us with maps, brochures, and some interesting background information about the Park and about the art installations of the world-famous British sculptor/artist Andy Goldsworthy, who creates site-specific sculptural creations using natural materials from the local environment. We visited our first Goldsworthy piece (Earth Wall) in an enclosed patio area of the Officers' Club before heading out on the hiking trails.



After passing through the Main Post area, we hiked along the Presidio Promenade, enjoying beautiful views of the Bay and Crissy Field. The early morning fog had completely burned off, and we enjoyed clear skies and warm weather for the rest of the day. We then hiked uphill to the National Cemetery Overlook, which features the Golden Gate Bridge in the background. Continuing on, we visited Goldsworthy's 100-foot-tall Spire, which he created from the trunks of 37 large Monterey cypress trees that were unable to survive long-term in the Presidio's climate. We continued on to the Inspiration Point Overlook before heading downhill to a picnic area that was also the site of the original spring that provided fresh water year-round to the early inhabitants of the area.

Then it was back uphill to reach the final Goldsworthy installation called Woodline. This serpentine line of eucalyptus branches stretches gracefully for more than 1200 feet along the forest floor, filling in a space that had been left when rows of Monterey Cyprus trees had died away. The combination of scenic beauty, historic settings, impressive works of art, and unbeatable weather made for a delightful hiking experience.



Getting there: Take the 280N / 19th Avenue route to the City. Take Park Presidio Blvd coming out of Golden Gate Park toward the Presidio. A right on California or Lake, then a left onto Arguello will take you into the heart of the Presidio. Start at the Officers' Club to pick up maps. There are numerous hiking trails, ranging from easy to moderate to difficult. (Our route was a combination of moderate and difficult.)

Directions: California Street runs parallel to Page Mill to the west. From the south (280), turn left off Page Mill to Hanover; left on California Avenue; turn left to Dartmouth. From north turn right off of El Camino onto California. On street parking is available on California Avenue near Dartmouth Street.

## **Huddart County Park (San Mateo)** *By Dee Baily with photo by John McCabe*

Tuesday, August 9, 13 of us spent some time amid second growth redwoods in Huddart Park off Kings Mountain Road in Woodside. We welcomed a number of first-time hikers to our group, including their spouses. We made good time, doing a 5-mile plus hike with 1100 feet cumulative elevation gain in about 2.5 hours (not including a lunch stop on some well-placed logs). This is one of the former logging areas which are making a rapid comeback with great second-growth redwoods and tanoak, coast live oak, bay laurel and Douglas fir. With a thick overhead canopy and well-drained trails,

this 16,000-acre park stays relatively cool in the hot summer sun (although we were lucky with the temperatures in the seventies that day); it is relatively protected from rain showers during the winter months.

Getting there: When coming to Huddart from the north (San Francisco) or the south (San Jose), use Highway 280. Turn off at the Woodside Road (Highway 84) exit. Turn westbound (toward Woodside). Proceed approximately 1.5 miles through the Town of Woodside. Turn right on Kings Mountain Road. Proceed up the hill to the main park entrance.

Bedwell Bayfront Park in Menlo Park is one of the Bay Area's hidden gems. People constantly go by it as they drive up and down the Bayshore Freeway, or take Marsh Road to go to and from the Dumbarton Bridge, without realizing it is there. The park's 160 acres are surrounded on three sides by the Don Edwards San Francisco Bay National Wildlife
