

Membership Renewal-Board Members Election: Summer is here, and you know what that means... drink plenty of fluids, enjoy yourselves and watch for news on membership renewal via our website and through email from us on Aug 1. The online renewal process will again open on Aug 1, making it easy for you to renew while simplifying our admin processes. Last year, more than 25% of our members renewed online in August; with your help we'd like to improve on last year's stats so we can focus on serving you in the best possible way.

Changes to Voting Process for New Board of Directors Members and Key Dates For Your Attention! By Oscar Lombardi, Nominations Committee Chair

We are very excited to let you know that the hard work from our Technical Team to simplify the voting process for our new members of the Board of Directors is well under way, and the testing is showing very positive results. A sincere thanks to all involved for making this process much easier for our members!!!

If you feel that the content of this message is familiar, well... it should be since we published some of the content in our two previous newsletters, but please take the time to read it for the first time? Or, if necessary, again if you've read it before, so you can help us with our simplification goal and at the same time make your side of the process much easier for you.

BIG CHANGE! Starting in <u>September</u>, the voting process will be via **email ONLY**, instead of through the hardcopy voting process from the past, whereby you had the option to vote by mailing your ballot to our mailbox. More news will be published in future newsletters and on our website with the details of how to vote. The Club Bylaws have been updated to include the new voting method for the election of Board Members.

KEY DATES AHEAD! Please keep these dates handy. Your prompt responses to actions help us with our administrative efficiency.

- Jul 15 Update or provide your email address (see notes below). Emails on Aug 1 and Sep 4 can only be sent if we have your email address.
- **Aug 1** Email sent to notify you that the membership drive has begun; renew and pay online. Email confirmation and thank you will be sent automatically. Deadline for renewing is **Nov 1**, final deadline Dec 31 to receive next year's Member Directory.
- **Sep 4** Email sent to you with opportunity to VOTE new Board members who have volunteered to serve; deadline for voting will be **Sep 30** (it used to be in Oct). Candidate bios will be included in this email.
- **Sep 15** Paper invoices mailed to homes for those who did NOT renew/pay online; <u>no</u> ballot will be included. Same renewal timeline as above. *NOTE: If you paid online before Sep 15, you will NOT receive a paper invoice, as was the case last year.*
- Nov 20 Paper reminder invoices mailed to homes for those who did <u>not</u> renew by Nov 1 deadline. Please renew in a timely fashion to save Club money and volunteer time.

We value your opinion! In order to be heard, we need your email.

<u>Do we have your current email on file?</u> Hint: If you receive our bi-monthly emails from Carol's Corner notifying you that the latest newsletter has been posted online, you do not need to do anything.

- Micro Focus tax liability on 2017 return. HPE shareholders received shares in a UK company -- Micro Focus -- in the September 2017 spinoff of HPE's software business. Due to unique circumstances, this transaction is taxable for US shareholders -- even if no Micro Focus stock has been sold. Some brokers and administrators either did not report -or reported incorrectly -- to the IRS. You can file an amended return, www.hpalumni.org/StockMFGPTax
- If you owned DXC shares on May 25, you received shares in a new company -- with corresponding adjustment in value of your DXC shares. www.hpalumni.org/StockPerspecta

Many have discovered that they have stock in more companies (as many as seven), located in more accounts, and with much less accurate cost basis values than they thought. You or your heirs could lose some of the stock or dividends as "abandoned" -- and you could wind up paying taxes twice on the same income. A team of HP Alumni volunteers has developed a step-by-step process to help you find all your stock, protect it from being treated as abandoned property, and prevent double taxation. www.hpalumni.org/stock

HPREC Technology Team Committee Report By Dan Burke, Tech Team Chair

Tech Team Charter

The HPREC Tech Team is comprised of Club volunteers with a charter to manage the ongoing infrastructure which supports Bay Area member communications and operational processes. The infrastructure includes the Club's website (hprecipers.org/hprec), the membership database, and the email platform used for regular email communication. The team also supports processes related to membership renewal, voting, annual Member Directory and report generation.

Team Members

The Tech Team is comprised of six, soon to be seven members, all of whom have had years of experience at Hewlett-Packard.

The team includes—front row, sitting: Carol Nakamoto and Tom Jew, and back row, standing: Dan Burke, Paula Hoelker-williams, Bernard Bruand, and Ed Tang. The soon

to be seventh member, Paul Hsia, immediate right, will join the Tech Team in August.



Each Tech Team member has specific responsibilities and brings a wealth of experience drawn from their careers at HP, Agilent and HP Credit Union.



- 1. **Bernard Bruand:** Originally from France, Bernard has lived in California since 1996. He started at HP in 1972 in France in field support, and then moved to Boeblingen, Germany before moving to Singapore in 1975 to start the Service Organization for HP Singapore and Malaysia when the sales office opened there. Bernard married his wife Yoke Ping in Singapore, then returned to France to serve as the European Support Training Manager. They remained in France for the next 18 years. They have two daughters who were born and raised there.
 - In 1996, Bernard transferred to the US to become the Worldwide Customer Hardware Support Training Manager. He had different jobs over the years, all related to customer support before retiring from HP in August 2012, after 40 years at HP on three continents.
 - Bernard and Yoke Ping's eldest daughter now lives in San Diego and is a scientist in biotechnologies. Their youngest daughter works in Redwood Shores in 'retirement financial services' (IRAs, etc.). Bernard enjoys traveling all over the world, skiing in winter, and gardening. He joined HPREC in 2012 and has been Club President since 2015.
- 2. Carol Nakamoto: Carol worked for HP in Human Resources from March 1966 through August 2000. Her positions included Corporate Personnel in Records/Benefits and the Mountain View Site in 1969 to help start up a Personnel Department for the three resident entities: Delcon Division, Customer Service Center, and Mountain View Division. Carol then moved to the Cupertino Site in 1981 to be Computer Groups Relocations Manager and Site Employment Manager, returning to Corporate in 1985 as Worldwide Relocations Manager for 10 years. In 1995, she helped start a new resource in Corporate as Worldwide HR Acquisitions & Divestitures Consultant until her retirement. She loved her HP career and appreciated HP's support in allowing her to stay in management for 13 years in a part-time capacity (first time in HP history) while helping raise their son (high school counselor) and daughter (high school teacher).

Carol enjoys retirement with her husband of 42 years, especially spending time at their Santa Cruz beach house and with their four young grandchildren who thankfully live in the Bay Area. She also enjoys traveling with her husband and with the full family, reading, gardening and volunteering.

Technology Team Committee Report (Continued...)

Carol first joined the HPREC Board in 2001, termed out in 2009, and rejoined in 2016. She serves as liaison to HP Inc., Hewlett Packard Enterprise, and First Tech Federal Credit Union. She writes *Carol's Corner* for the newsletter. Besides the Tech Team, she is also a member of the Newsletter, Membership, and Communications Committees.

- 3. **Dan Burke:** Dan joined HP in June 1988 in a pre-sales organization called Customer Information Center (CIC) where he supported prospective customers. In his role, he worked with HP Enterprise hardware (HP3000 & HP9000) as well as networking solutions; later, he became the manager of the team. Dan's next career move was with the Computer Solutions Organization (CSO) as Internet Program Manager, managing the web presence in the early days of HP's presence on the web. From there, he moved to the Personal Systems Group (PSG) in a similar capacity. But then he found his real calling as a Web Content Manager. For the next 15 years, Dan managed various systems and processes where marketing teams created new product content. Near the end of his career, he moved to the Corporate Marketing Organization where he helped evolve hp.com to a new standard. He retired from HP in June 2012.
 - Dan is happily married with three wonderful children, and one grandchild. He loves golf, woodworking, music, and backpacking in the High Sierra country. He joined HPREC in 2013 and the Tech Team in November 2015, assuming the chair role in November 2016.
- 4. **Ed Tang:** Ed was employed at HP and Agilent for over 30 years. He started in R&D as a software developer. Subsequently, he worked in product quality and localization, then transitioned to Corporate IT working on HR systems.
 - In retirement, Ed is a tutor in math, physics, chemistry and statistics. As a member of the Tech Team, he supports the Club's website, primarily with the online services, and maintains the membership database and program. Ed especially enjoys spending time with his grandchildren. He joined the Tech Team during the summer of 2010.
- 5. **Paula Hoelker-williams:** Paula joined HP in 1993 and spent 10 years there in various IT management positions. In mid-1998, she transferred to HPCU/Addison Avenue and soon after served as CIO until retirement in mid-2009. She joined the HPREC Board in November 2010 as Tech Team Chair and held the role through two terms ending in October 2016. Paula remains an active member of the Tech Team to support the team's efforts to enhance/maintain the technical aspects of the Club's operations. She loves engaging and working with HP people/retirees: smart, stimulating, fun, diverse, down-to-earth; it doesn't get any better for her.
 - Besides HPREC, Paula keeps busy by caring for her two dog and six cat rescues, and helping local authors with their formatting, editing and self-publishing needs. She is patiently waiting for her husband of 40 years to decide to retire.
- 6. **Tom Jew:** After graduating from business school and spending a short period of time as a financial analyst at a Chicago bank, Tom went to work for HP in 1973. 

Meet at the Usual Carpool Location* Alternately take I-280 to Hwy 92 West towards Half Moon Bay. Turn left at Hwy 1, travel south to Pescadero Road. Go inland on Pescadero Road and go 2.6 miles through the town of Pescadero to Cloverdale Road and take a right. After 4.2 miles, turn left onto the entrance road for Butano State Park. The entry kiosk has a \$10 parking fee (\$9 for seniors) or you can use your State Parks Pass. Our hike begins at the picnic/parking area on your right.

We will hike the Six Bridges Trail and the Little Butano Creek Trail, as well as portions of the Goat Hill Trail.

Castle Rock State Park Hike By Klaus Model (Leader) with photo by Gary Ruppel

From the main entrance on Skyline Boulevard, the group of 10 hikers followed the Saratoga Gap Trail downhill to the Castle Rock Falls observation platform. Being early in the year, there was a good amount of water in the falls. We went over the very rocky trail to Russell Point and almost to the Castle Rock Trail Camp. The trail alternated between brushy hillsides and madrone and oak filled canyons, about a quarter of it exposed to the sun. The weather co-operated; it was sunny but not too hot. An ample supply of water to prevent dehydration and long pants to protect us from the ubiquitous

poison oak came in handy.

We saw some wildflowers but no animals. A couple of birds of prey were out riding the updrafts. We had lunch on a shady place among the rocks with a good view of the San Lorenzo Headwaters. After lunch, a short hike brought us to the intersection with the Ridge Trail. After a shady but steep ascent (which made us wonder about Gary Ruppel's insight that "on the average our hikes are flat." We arrived at Goat Rock, the most impressive rock outcropping in the park. There we watched some rock climbers and

decided that for us the clambering over the rocks on the trail was challenging enough. Another mile down and up again brought us back to the parking lot. A great 6-mile hike, challenging, however, well within the capability of the group.

Getting there: The park entrance is located about two miles southeast of the intersection of State Route 35 (Skyline Boulevard) and State Route 9 beyond Saratoga. Look for a line of automobiles on the road just past the entrance. You can avoid the \$8 parking fee by parking there and walking back to the entrance and trailhead.

Our Lite Hike for May was the 2.6-mile Devil's Slide Trail located just south of Pacifica. Eight hikers enjoyed a sunny hike along the coast. Although the trail is noted for having interesting rock formations, many lush plants were also present. Those seen were dudleyas, lupines, golden poppies, sticky monkey flowers, Ceanothus, wild mustard, and purple tree echium. This trail has tremendous views of crashing surf when the weather is good. The group was able to see the Farallon Islands and Point Reves.

Restrooms were available at the beginning of the hike at the south parking area and also at the turn around point near the north parking lot.

To reach the trail directly, from Hwy 92 in Half Moon Bay, take Hwy 1 north past Montara to Gray Whale Cove State Beach. The parking on right is for use when the South Devil's Slide Parking is full. Continue north for about a mile and park in one of the two parking lots at the south end of the trail. These lots are on the left before the tunnel. A faster route is I-280 exiting at Skyline to Sharp Park Road right onto Francisco Blvd, sharp right onto Hwy 1 through the tunnel and then immediately right into the south parking lots.

She loved the old HP, with its culture of cooperation, contribution, and unshakable integrity, and played many different management roles in different parts of the company until her retirement in 1999, including a pioneering role in software quality management at the division, group, and corporate level, and a key strategic position as the highest-ranking woman in Personnel, with worldwide responsibility for HP's compensation and benefits programs. Throughout her career, Sally served as a mentor and role model for countless younger women navigating their way through the still predominantly male culture of a traditional engineering company.

After retiring on the cusp of the Carly era, Sally turned her positive energy to volunteer tutoring and even teaching calculus at a start-up school in East Palo Alto, Eastside College Preparatory School, which has since compiled a remarkable record of sending all of its underserved minority students on to four-year colleges for the last 19 years.

Sally is survived by her husband of 41 years, Chuck Sieloff (whom she met at HP), by her two daughters and their husbands (Christy and David Story; Lindsay and Casey Pera), and by six wonderful grandchildren (James, Charlie, Chris, Sage, Cricket, and Ember).
