**Membership Renewal:** I would like to thank all of you who have renewed your Club membership. Renewal started on August 1 with the ONLINE RENEWAL process, which as you know makes it easy for you, and at the same time, simplifies our admin processes. At the time of closure of this publication, 391 people renewed online, **THANK YOU!** 

If you have not yet renewed, please do so by Nov 16. A few days after, we will be sending membership renewal reminders, and we would like to keep these to a minimum.

**Pat** joined HP in 1969 and has spent most of her career in human resources working in a variety of functions and entities. From 1989 to 1999, she was the HR Manager for the Software Services Division (SSD). Pat retired from HP in 1999 after 30 years of service.



Pat has spent her retirement years pursuing her passion for travel, movies, reading, cooking, and attending to her more than 25 rose bushes. ## From the Historian By Gary Ruppel

Welcome. With this November 2018 issue, we formally embark on the fiscal year that we celebrate the **40**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary** of the founding of our Club. It was on April 4, 1979 that Fred Andersen (a recent retiree from HP Associates) invited four other retirees to join him for lunch at Max's Tea Room in Los Altos to consider forming a club for HP retirees. The goal was to create a non-profit club which would provide opportunities for retirees to socialize, maintain friendships, and to enjoy travel and various activities together. The group decided to move fast. Ray Rooney, who attended that



first meeting, was elected president in early 1980 when the Club had about 60 members. Since Ray, there have been 25 Presidents serving terms of one to four years.

Naming the Club (for which the first annual dues were \$3.00) produced some interesting inputs, such as:

- H-P Postgraduates
- H-P R.A.H.S. (Retired and Happy Seniors)
- H-P Maturatiers
- H-P H.O.P (Happy Old Pensioners)
- H-P Happy Has Beens
- H-P Gadabouts

Fortunately, a more simplified and less controversial name prevailed!

The Club rapidly swung into action by hosting a luncheon in June 1979 at which then CEO, John Young, gave a presentation. The next event scheduled for September 1979 was a trip to HP's Santa Rosa Division. Many events soon followed, with excursions to San Francisco, Hearst Castle via the Coast Starlight, and a barbeque luncheon at San Felipe Ranch (owned by Dave and Bill) south of San Jose. More activities became "regulars," including the annual Holiday Luncheon, the Spring Fling, and the Summer Picnic. Monthly activities of hiking, golf, bridge (no longer active), and bowling all followed. The HP/Agilent Retiree Volunteer group formally joined HPREC in 2004. The volunteer organization had run independently for 10 years.

The Club reached its peak membership of nearly 2,300 in the mid 2000s, and due to many factors, has declined significantly to about 1000. However, this decline in numbers has not diminished the spirit of the many Club members and volunteers who keep the organization running smoothly and contributing to the local Bay Area communities in which we are located. Fred Andersen's goal of providing a sense of "togetherness" for retirees is still flourishing.

#### Meet at Almaden County Park, McAbee Road Entrance

This will definitely be the most level hike of the year. I don't mean that on average it will be level, as we end where we begin. I mean that the only hill to climb is maybe 20 feet high. The 6.4 mile loop will get us sufficient exercise, however.

This hike, starting at Byxbee Park, will have great views of the bay and lots of birds to see. One can expect to see lots of ducks such as shoveler, canvasback, ruddy, mallard, pintail, gadwall, wigeon, and goldeneye. Also seen regularly are egrets, herons, avocets, stilts, godwits, willets, sandpipers, harriers, pelicans, coots, cormorants, and grebes.

We will be hiking on pavement and gravel topped levees. The surface should be good even if it has rained. We'll see Charleston and Mayfield Sloughs, plus Matadero and Adobe Creeks. We will eat our lunch by Mountain View's Shoreline Lake.

Please carpool as parking is limited at Byxbee Park.

To meet at Byxbee Park, exit Embarcadero Road East (towards the airport and bay) from Highway 101. Take Embarcadero Road past the golf course to where it ends at a "T" intersection. Turn right at the "T" towards the recycling center. Turn left into Byxbee Park (the recycling center is on the right). Park in the parking lot.
